General Code of Conduct

All coaches, players and participants, shall abide by the General Code of Conduct and Disciplinary Policy. All players and participants shall be required to review and sign the front page of this registration form before participating.

The WYSA is committed to providing the opportunity for boys and girls to play soccer in an atmosphere that is conducive to the development of athletic skills, positive personal values and sound community spirit.

To achieve that atmosphere, coaches, players and participants must always conduct themselves in a manner that will reflect favorably on themselves, their team and the league. Coaches, players and participants should serve as examples. They have an obligation to inform parents and partisan spectators that their actions also must be sportsmanlike. At no time should the excitement of the game be allowed to bring forth loud, derisive actions that serve only to detract from the integrity of the game.

To deal with any unsportsmanlike actions that may occur at league soccer games, the WYSA has adopted a discipline policy. The WYSA has the authority to take appropriate action against any coach, player, participant and parent/spectator involved in unsportsmanlike conduct.

Disciplinary Policy

A **major** infraction shall include, but not be limited to:

- 1) Nonconsensual or reckless physical contact with a referee, coach or player.
- 2) Spitting, throwing or kicking anything at a referee, coach or player.
- 3) Participating in a physical altercation with any participant in the game.

Any coach, player or other participant found guilty by the league of a major infraction shall be suspended for 1 game serviced by the WYSA, with no regard to the suspension occurring in the regular or playoff season. All suspensions shall be served as soon as practicable, beginning with the next scheduled game. The suspension will carry over into the succeeding season if not practicable to the current season. Consequent infractions could result in additional suspension to be determined by the WYSA board.

A **minor** infraction shall include, but not be limited to:

- 1) Use of profanity toward any game participant.
- 2) Verbal abuse of referees.
- 3) Red card ejection from a game.
- 4) Use of tobacco products, alcohol or illegal drugs during a WYSA game.
- 5) Intentional violation of WYSA or CJSA rules.

Any coach, player or other participant found to be guilty by the WYSA of a minor infraction shall be given either a verbal or written warning. Consequent infractions could result in a suspension to be determined by the WYSA board. (For a longer version of the Disciplinary Policy see the website – www.winstedyouthsoccer.com)
